Uniform



Spare labelled clothes to be left in school in a labelled carrier bag-even if fully toilet trained


Please label your child's clothes with their name- including coats, hats scarves etc.


In all weathers the children will have access to the outdoor area, please ensure they have suitable coats, hats etc. and they know which ones are theirs.

A waterproof coat and wellies will be sufficient wear for Fresh Air Friday. You can leave wellies in school.








Our 'Gold Star' challenge:




Children will receive their gold star if their diaries have been signed at least three times in the week





Gold stars every week will mean children will be able to wear their own clothes for a day at the end of each term.


